

1 PREP LEAVE

6th March 2026 is a preparatory leave for students. All teachers and mentors must report to school — regular working day for staff.

2 EXAM TIMINGS

School timing during exams: 8:30 a.m. to 12:00 noon. Students must arrive and depart within these hours only.

3 NO EXAM = NO SCHOOL

On days with no exam for a class (including Nursery–III), students need NOT come to school. No formal classes will be held.

4 ADMIT CARD & UNIFORM

Students must wear proper school uniform and carry Admit Card + ID Card on every examination day without fail.

5 STATIONERY RULE

Borrowing and lending strictly not allowed. Students must bring their own water bottle, sanitizer, and all stationery.

6 ANSWER SCRIPT REVIEW

Answer scripts shown to parents on 23rd March 2026 only, 9:30–11:30 a.m. Scripts not collected will not be shown afterwards.

7 RESULT DECLARATION

Results declared on Saturday, 28th March 2026. Parents must make arrangements to collect report cards on the declared date.

8 NEW SESSION

New academic session 2026–27 commences from 1st April 2026. Admission enquiries may be directed to the school office.
